

## The California Transparency in Supply Chains Act of 2010 (SB 657)

## **Disclosure Statement**

The California Transparency in Supply Chains Act of 2010 (SB 657) is designed to increase the amount of information made available by manufacturers and retailers regarding efforts to address the issue of slavery and human trafficking.

Luvata Special Products believes that workers at its suppliers' facilities have the right to freely choose employment. Luvata Special Products further expects that all suppliers who do business with Luvata Special Products and its subsidiaries will comply with all applicable laws, including the laws against forced or involuntary labor. This expectation is embodied in Luvata Special Products' Code of Conduct. Specifically, the Human Rights Section of the Code of Conduct expresses support for the Ten Principles of the UN Global Compact. Luvata Special Products is not aware that any of its suppliers engage in human trafficking or slavery. Accordingly, Luvata Special Products does not verify its supply chains to evaluate the risks of human trafficking or slavery, audit its suppliers for compliance with or require suppliers to certify compliance with the laws regarding human trafficking and slavery, provide training relating thereto, or maintain internal accountability standards relating thereto apart from the Luvata Special Products Code of Conduct provisions that require Luvata Special Products associates to comply with all applicable laws.

This disclosure applies to all consolidated Luvata Special Products subsidiaries that are California taxpayers subject to the California Transparency in Supply Chains Act.
